General Youth Sheep Show Rules

1. Open to all youth between ages 7 and 18 or Senior in high school on January 1 of current year.
2. Entries for the Youth Sheep Show are to be made on the Livestock Entry form. Copies may be downloaded from the website: www.rheacountyfair.org or found in the Fair Catalog.
3. The exhibitor and one parent/adult will be admitted to fairgrounds at no charge. No bedding will be furnished.
4. Exhibitor must be present and show their animal unless they have more than one animal in the same class.
5. Health papers for each animal will be required.
6. All sheep being shown must be in place by at least 10:00 a.m. on September 3. Animals will be released after this show or after 6:00 p.m. whichever comes last.

Breeding Sheep

- Class 1 - Hampshire
- Class 2 - Shropshire
- Class 3 - Suffolk
- Class 4 - Southdown
- Class 5 - Tunis
- Class 6 - Other Breeds (Meat)
- Class 7 - Other Breeds (Wool)

Rules

1. All animals entered must be purebred and registered in the name of the exhibitor, transferred to the exhibitor or leased by the exhibitor. The registration papers and/or lease agreements must be presented the day of the show.
2. Exhibitors are allowed to enter no more than two animals in any one lot.
3. Lots with more than 10 entries will be divided by age.
4. Breed classes must have a minimum of 10 entries pre-entered or will show as Other Breeds

Lot

- 01 - Senior Ram Lambs (born September 1 - December 31 last year)
- 02 - Early Junior Ram Lambs (born January 1- February 14 this year)
- 03 - Late Junior Ram Lambs (born February 15 this year or later)
- 04 - Champion Ram (Lots 1,2 and 3)
- 05 - Reserve Champion Ram
- 06 - Senior Yearling Ewes (born September 1 year before last - February 14 last year)
- 07 - Junior Yearling Ewes (born February 15 - August 31 last year)
- 08 - Senior Ewe Lambs (born September 1 - December 31 last year)
- 09 - Early Junior Ewe Lambs (born January 1 - January 31 this year)
- 10 - Intermediate Junior Ewe Lamb (born February 1 - February 29 this year)
- 11 - Late Junior Ewe lambs (born March 1 this year or later)
- 12 - Champion Ewe (Lots 6, 7 ,8, 9, 10, 11)
- 13 - Reserve Champion Ewe

Class 8 - Commercial Ewes

Rules

1. Open to non-registered ewe lambs and yearlings of any breed or combination of breeds.
2. Ewe lambs must have all milk teeth.
3. Yearling ewes may have no more than four permanent teeth.
4. Ewes will be weighed and assigned to classes according to weight.
5. An exhibitor may have no more than 4 entries in each lot.
6. General rules apply.

Lot

- 01 - White faced commercial ewe lambs
- 02 - White faced commercial yearling ewes
- 03 - Champion white faced ewe (Lots 1 and 2)
- 04 - Reserve champion white faced ewe
- 05 - Black faced commercial ewe lambs
- 06 - Black faced commercial yearling ewes
- 07 - Champion black faced ewe (Lots 5 and 6)
- 08 - Reserve champion black faced ewe

Class 9 - Market Lambs

Rules

1. An exhibitor can show no more than four lambs in this class.
2. All market lambs must have lamb teeth and must be wethers or ewes.
3. Ewe lambs shown as market lambs cannot be show in ewe classes.
4. Lambs must weight at least 75 pounds with no maximum weight.
5. Lambs will be weighed and divided into classes by weight. Ten lambs per class.
6. There will not be a sale in connection with this show.
7. There will be a Champion and Reserve Champion selected for each lot.

Lot

- 01 - Black faced cross breeds
- 02 - White faced cross breeds
- 03 - Grand Champion market lamb
- 04 - Reserve Champion market lamb

Class 10 - Pee Wee Sheep Herders

1. Class is open to any boy or girl up to the 4th grade, who is not a 4-H member.
2. Sheep need not be owned by the children exhibiting them.
3. All entries will receive a ribbon and/or prize.
4. Open to all sheep breeds and commercial animals including market lambs.
